Introduction

The Health-Related Behaviour Survey, developed by the Schools Health Education Unit, is designed for young people of primary and secondary school age. The surveys have been developed over 30 years by health and education professionals, and over a million school children have taken part. In the last ten years, over four thousand schools and colleges have participated. Data arising from the survey can be used to inform planning decisions as well as being used in the classroom as the stimulus for discussion with young people.

This report should ideally be studied with reference to the original questionnaire and the survey results tables. The first is recommended because we may have paraphrased a question below for reasons of space, and the precise wording and position may be important for interpretation.

Preceding this report you should have received **The Survey Results Tables** (or online results), which contain more information than can be summarised here. You may want to refer to this if you want to look in more detail at the results of a particular question. The Survey Results Tables show the number of responses received for each question, which may be less than the total sample. Also in the Results Tables we show the results of each response for multiple-choice questions, whereas in this report answers may be selective or grouped.

A school's results are confidential and will not be shared with other organisations without the express permission of the school.

Additional services (graphs and discs) are available; please contact SHEU. In particular, we have designed a set of INSET workshops around different examples of using the questionnaire data. Please note that 2 (2) pupil(s) described themselves as transgender or described themselves in another way, 0 (0) pupil(s) did not want to say and 1 (1) pupil(s) did not provide a response; 0 (0) didn't specify what year group they are in. These pupils will not be included in any tables or charts which are split by sex or year respectively, however they will be included in any total figures.

If the sample you sent to Exeter for analysis was small, then it may have been aggregated by sex or year, or merged with a sample from another school or schools. This is done so that the figures are not too influenced by the behaviour of any one individual, and to ensure that the anonymity of the respondents is not compromised. If you would like to discuss this in more detail, please contact the Unit directly..

In the report, you may see '-' in the tables or text (e.g. '-%'). This means we have suppressed the result because the number of valid responses for an item has dropped below 7 pupils. This may happen part-way through the report, if children start but don't complete the questionnaire for some reason.

Background

ETHNICITY

- 79% (79%) of pupils responded that they are White.

School

- 75% (75%) of pupils responded that their school cares whether they are happy or not, while 6% (6%) said their school doesn't.
- 61% (61%) of pupils responded that they set their own targets and are helped to meet them. 14% (14%) disagreed with this statement.
- 84% (84%) of pupils responded that their school prepares them for when they leave the school, while 3% (3%) said it doesn't.

ENJOYMENT

- 40% (40%) of pupils responded that they like going to school, while 20% (20%) said they don't and 40% (40%) said they 'sometimes' do.
- 11% (11%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'hardly any' of their lessons at school.
- 58% (58%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'about half' of their lessons at school.
- 31% (31%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'all' of their lessons at school.
- 75% (75%) of pupils responded that they rated the lessons they have had about keeping themselves safe as 'good'; 69% (69%) said the same about lessons on healthy eating.
- 67% (67%) of pupils responded that their school asks for the opinions of students, while 7% (7%) said it doesn't.
- 60% (60%) of pupils responded that the opinions of students make a difference to decisions, while 11% (11%) said they don't.

Being Healthy

HEALTHY WEIGHT

- 42% (42%) of pupils responded that they consider their health when choosing what to eat, while 14% (14%) said they don't and 43% (43%) 'sometimes' do.
- 82% (82%) of pupils responded that they ate breakfast on the morning of the survey.
- 96% (96%) of pupils responded that they ate lunch on the day before the survey.
- 38% (38%) of pupils responded that they eat fruit and veg every day, while 16% (16%) said they don't and 46% (46%) 'sometimes' do.

DENTAL HEALTH

- 6% (6%) of pupils responded that they usually clean their teeth 'less than once a day'.
- 74% (74%) of pupils responded that they usually clean their teeth at least 'twice a day'.
- 71% (71%) of pupils responded that they visit the dentist at least once a year, while 19% (19%) said they 'don't know' if they do.

Bullying

- 38% (38%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' feel scared to go to school because of other children.
- 9% (9%) of pupils responded that their school doesn't deal with bullying well, while 23% (23%) said it 'sometimes' does.
- 68% (68%) of pupils responded that their school deals with bullying well.
- 32% (32%) of pupils responded that they have been bullied at least 'sometimes' in the last 12 months (incl. cyberbullying).
- 42% (42%) of pupils responded that they were called nasty names at least 'sometimes' in the month before the survey; 32% (32%) said they were pushed/hit.
- 29% (29%) of pupils responded that they have experienced negative behaviour at least 'sometimes' during lesson time at school; 22% (22%) said they have experienced it online.

Activities

SPORT AND EXERCISE

- 19% (19%) of pupils responded that they don't do any physical activity each day, while 41% (41%) said they do 'a little (less than an hour)'.
- 40% (40%) of pupils responded that they do 'a fair bit (1-2 hours)' of physical activity each day.
- 34% (34%) of pupils responded that they played with friends after school on the day before the survey, while 18% (18%) said they went to a club.

GETTING AROUND

- 83% (83%) of pupils responded that it easy for them to get to school, while 13% (13%) said it 'sometimes' is.
- 54% (54%) of pupils responded that it easy for them to get somewhere to meet friends, while 25% (25%) said it 'sometimes' is.
- 72% (72%) of pupils responded that it easy for them to get to shops, while 17% (17%) said it 'sometimes' is.

- ❑ 59% (59%) of pupils responded that it easy for them to get somewhere to play sport or do exercise, while 20% (20%) said it 'sometimes' is.

ACCIDENTS

- ❑ 51% (51%) of pupils responded that they have been to see a doctor or nurse about an accident or injury at least 'once or twice' in the last year; 12% (12%) said they have been 'a lot'.

FEELING HAPPY

- ❑ 10% (10%) of pupils responded that they do not feel happy most of the time.
- ❑ 50% (50%) of pupils responded that they feel happy most of the time.

FEELING SAFE

- ❑ 8% (8%) of pupils responded that they do not feel safe at school.
- ❑ 70% (70%) of pupils responded that they feel safe at school.
- ❑ 3% (3%) of pupils responded that they do not feel safe at home.
- ❑ 89% (89%) of pupils responded that they feel safe at home.
- ❑ 16% (16%) of pupils responded that they do not feel safe outside when not at school or at home.

INTERNET SAFETY

- ❑ 81% (81%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' communicate (chat or message) online with friends and family they know in real life.
- ❑ 29% (29%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' communicate (chat or message) with people they have met online and don't know in real life.
- ❑ 35% (35%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' communicate (chat or message) online by posting things that lots of people can see, while 41% (41%) said they use picture/video sharing sites/apps.
- ❑ 94% (94%) of pupils responded that they have been told how to keep themselves safe when online.

Feelings

WORRIES

- ❑ 78% (78%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' worry about family; 61% (61%) said they worry about exams and tests.
- ❑ 88% (88%) of pupils responded that if they were worried or upset, they would at least 'sometimes' talk to their Mum and/or Dad, while 82% (82%) said they would talk to a teacher.

PERSEVERANCE

- ❑ 80% (80%) of pupils responded that, if at first they don't succeed, they at least 'sometimes' keep on trying until they do and 85% (85%) said they ask for help.

Year 8+: Risky Behaviour

ALCOHOL

- ❑ 43% (43%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they have tasted an alcoholic drink.
- ❑ 5% (5%) of pupils Year 8+ responded that they have tasted an alcoholic drink in the week before the survey.

SMOKING

- ❑ 58% (58%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that someone in their family smokes.
- ❑ 15% (15%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that someone smokes in a car when they are in it with them.
- ❑ 5% (5%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they think they will smoke when they are older, while 17% (17%) said they 'don't know' if they will.

FUTURE PLANS

- ❑ 52% (52%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they would like to continue in full-time education when they can leave school.
- ❑ 81% (81%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they would like to find a job when they can leave school.
- ❑ 50% (50%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they would like to get training for a skilled job/get an apprenticeship when they can leave school.

SEX AND RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION

- ❑ 89% (89%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they have had lessons about sex and relationships, while 4% (4%) said they 'don't know' if they have.
- ❑ 51% (51%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they have had lessons about sex and relationships and said the lessons were 'good', while 2% (2%) said they were 'poor'.
- ❑ Of the 194 (194) Year 8+ pupils who have had lessons and about sex and relationships, 55% (55%) said they were 'good'.
- ❑ 91% (91%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they are straight/heterosexual.
- ❑ 6% (6%) of Year 8+ pupils responded that they are gay/lesbian, while 8% (8%) said they are bisexual.

Year 10+: Relationships

- ❑ 21% (21%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they would at least 'sometimes' put up with a boyfriend or girlfriend who was nasty to them.
- ❑ 82% (82%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they would at least 'sometimes' know where they could get help if they had a boyfriend or girlfriend who was nasty to them; 78% (78%) said they would get help.
- ❑ 7% (7%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they have had sex, while 3% (3%) said they 'don't know' if they have.
- ❑ 5% (5%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they have had sex and always used contraception or protection, while 4% (4%) said they 'don't know' if they did.

Significant Differences

Where differences can be seen between your school and the reference sample, you may find the enclosed table of some use in deciding if the differences seen are significant. The 'standard error' of a proportion is an assessment of how reliable our figures are, that is, the margin of error.

Two points in particular should be made:

1. when the sample size is small, it may be that just one individual voting a different way would make a large percentage difference to the results (so, one in twenty is 5%)
2. even if your sample is small, you may have a very high proportion of your available population – if, say, you sample every single pupil of your year 8 class. In this case, the notion of 'margin of error' doesn't really apply to the sampling, only to the process of collecting the responses.

So, if you have a sample of 50 students and 30% of them think that the school needs a new swimming pool, we can see from the table that standard error of the percentage is about $\pm 6.5\%$.




























