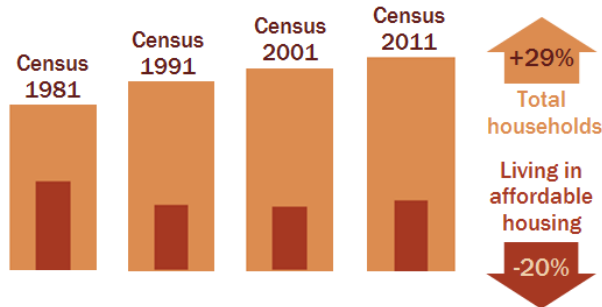


What does the affordable housing profile of Surrey look like?

56,749 Surrey households were living in affordable housing¹ in 2011

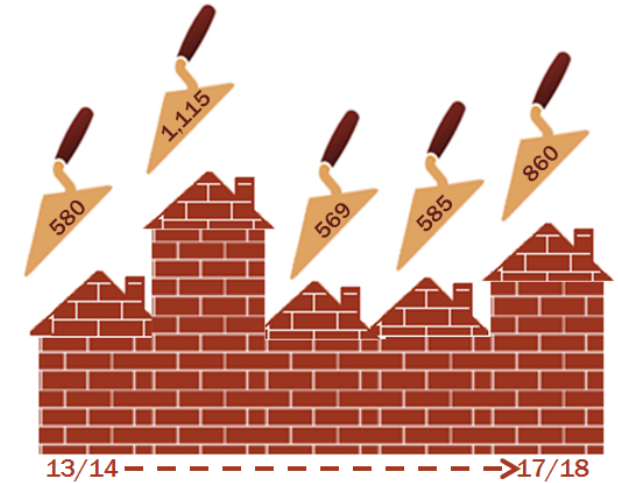
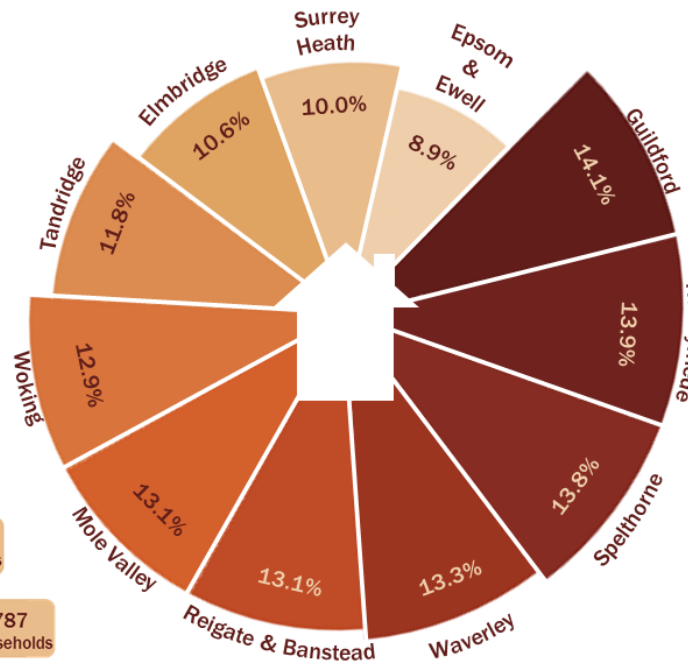


Since 1981, the total number of households has increased, while the number of those living in affordable housing has fallen



Since 2014, the number of households in temporary accommodation³ has increased each year

The 2011 Census shows Guildford had the highest proportion of households living in affordable housing



In 2017/18, there were more affordable housing completions² than in either of the previous 2 years



In 2018, one in seven households on housing waiting lists across Surrey secured a tenancy
