Introduction

The Health-Related Behaviour Survey, developed by the Schools Health Education Unit, is designed for young people of primary and secondary school age. The surveys have been developed over 30 years by health and education professionals, and over a million school children have taken part. In the last ten years, over four thousand schools and colleges have participated. Data arising from the survey can be used to inform planning decisions as well being used in the classroom as the stimulus for discussion with young people.

This report should ideally be studied with reference to the original questionnaire and the survey results tables. The first is recommended because we may have paraphrased a question below for reasons of space, and the precise wording and position may be important for interpretation.

Preceding this report you should have received **The Survey Results Tables** (or online results), which contain more information than can be summarised here. You may want to refer to this if you want to look in more detail at the results of a particular question. The Survey Results Tables show the number of responses received for each question, which may be less than the total sample. Also in the Results Tables we show the results of each response for multiple-choice questions, whereas in this report answers may be selective or grouped.

A school's results are confidential and will not be shared with other organisations without the express permission of the school.

Additional services (graphs and discs) are available; please contact SHEU. In particular, we have designed a set of INSET workshops around different examples of using the questionnaire data. Background

ETHNICITY

83% (77%) of pupils responded that they are White British.

HOME LIFE

- □ 65% (68%) of pupils responded that they live with their Mum and Dad together.
- □ 14% (15%) of pupils responded that they live 'mainly or only' with their Mum, while 3% (2%) said they live 'mainly or only' with their Dad.

SPECIAL NEEDS

- 1% (1%) of pupils responded that someone helped them to fill in the questionnaire, while 2% (2%) said they are 'not sure' if someone helped them and 2% (1%) didn't want to say.
- 1% (1%) of pupils responded that they are disabled, while 3% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they are and 2% (1%) didn't want to say.
- 13% (13%) of pupils responded that they have a long-standing illness, while 6% (6%) said they are 'not sure' if they have and 0% (1%) didn't want to say.
- 8% (9%) of pupils responded that they have a special educational need or learning difficulty, while 6% (8%) said they are 'not sure' if they have and 1% (1%) didn't want to say.
- 5% (7%) of pupils responded that their additional needs are properly looked after in school, while 2% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they are and 7% (7%) don't have any needs like that.
- □ This works out as 40% (55%) of the 30 (272) pupils with additional needs responding that their needs are properly looked after.

YOUNG CARERS

- □ 5% (6%) of pupils responded that they are a 'young carer', while 3% (4%) said they are 'not sure' if they are and 2% (1%) didn't want to say.
- 3% (2%) of pupils responded that being a young carer takes up at least an hour of their time each day, while 0% (1%) said it takes up less than an hour.

ARMED FORCES

5% (3%) of pupils responded that they have a parent/carer who is in the British Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force or the Reserves, while 4% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they do and 0% (0%) didn't want to say.

O% (0%) of pupils responded that their Mum or Dad is in the British Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force or the Reserves, while 0% (0%) said their Mum or Dad's partner is.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

□ 7% (8%) of pupils responded that they currently have free school meals, while 18% (11%) said they have had them in the last 6 years and 1% (2%) said they could have them if they wanted.

Healthy Eating

CONTROL OVER HEALTH

- 96% (92%) of pupils agreed with at least one statement about being in control of their health (Q12a&c).
- 49% (51%) of pupils agreed with at least one statement saying that they weren't in control of their health (Q12b&d).
- 87% (78%) of pupils responded that they are in charge of their health, while 46% (46%) said that even if they look after themselves, they can still easily fall ill.

WEIGHT & APPEARANCE

- □ 6% (7%) of pupils responded that they would like to put on weight.
- □ 40% (41%) of pupils responded that they would like to lose weight.
- □ 54% (52%) of pupils responded that they are happy with their weight as it is.
- 24% (22%) of pupils responded that they are the main thing that affects the way they feel about their appearance, while 38% (36%) said comments/attitudes of other people at school affect them.

HEALTHY CHOICES

- 59% (55%) of boys and 58% (49%) of girls responded that they 'never' or only 'sometimes' consider their health when choosing what to eat.
- 16% (19%) of boys and 17% (24%) of girls responded that they 'very often' or 'always' consider their health when choosing what to eat.

5-A-DAY

11% (7%) of pupils responded that they didn't eat any portions of fruit or vegetables on the day before the survey. 19% (22%) of pupils responded that they ate at least 5 portions of fruit and vegetables on the day before the survey.

LUNCH

- 31% (38%) of pupils responded that they had school food for lunch on the day before the survey.
- □ 17% (13%) of pupils responded that they didn't have any lunch on the day before the survey.
- 85% (74%) of pupils responded that the place where they can get a school lunch is crowded and 57% (58%) said it is busy.

BREAKFAST

- 14% (12%) of pupils responded that they didn't have anything to eat or drink before lessons on the day of the survey.
- □ 13% (8%) of pupils responded that they only had a drink before lessons on the day of the survey.
- 26% (25%) of pupils responded that they had toast or bread before lessons on the day of the survey, while 10% (13%) had fruit.

FOOD & DRINK

- □ 43% (51%) of pupils responded that they eat fresh fruit 'on most days'; 51% (58%) said the same for vegetables.
- □ 32% (29%) of pupils responded that they 'rarely or never' eat fish/fish fingers.

Alcohol, Smoking & Drugs PEER PERCEPTION

- 7% (6%) of pupils responded that they believe at least 'most' people their age drank alcohol in the week before the survey. 46% (46%) said 'none or just a few' did.
- 4% (3%) of pupils responded that they believe at least 'most' people their age were drunk at least once in the 7 days before the survey. 63% (61%) said 'none or just a few' were.
- 13% (8%) of pupils responded that they believe at least 'most' people their age smoked a cigarette in the 7 days before the survey. 38% (42%) said 'none or just a few' did.
- 4% (2%) of pupils responded that they believe at least 'most' people their age took cannabis in the 7 days before the survey. 63% (70%) said 'none or just a few' did.

ALCOHOL

- 12% (12%) of pupils responded that they had an alcoholic drink in the 7 days before the survey.
- 3% (3%) of pupils responded that they were drunk in the 7 days before the survey.
- □ 1% (0%) of boys and 0% (0%) of girls drank over the advised weekly limit of alcohol for adult females of 14 units.
- 2% (3%) of pupils responded that they drank beer or lager in the 7 days before the survey and 2% (2%) said they drank spirits.

- 42% (54%) of pupils responded that they 'never' drink alcohol.
- 27% (26%) of pupils responded that if they ever drink alcohol, their parents/carers 'always' know, while 14% (9%) said their parents/carers 'usually' know.
- □ This works out as 46% (57%) of those who do drink alcohol responding that their parents 'always know'.
- 18% (10%) of pupils responded that if they ever drink alcohol, their parents/carers 'never' or only 'sometimes' know.

ALCOHOL & DRUG INFORMATION

 57% (49%) of pupils responded that they would know where to go if they wanted information or support about alcohol or drugs, while 15% (19%) said they wouldn't know where to go.

SMOKING

- □ 25% (17%) of pupils responded that they have smoked in the past or smoke now.
- □ 5% (2%) of pupils responded that they smoke 'regularly'.
- Of the 13 (37) pupils who smoke regularly, 15% (43%) said they would like to give up.
- □ 5% (3%) of pupils responded that they have smoked in the 7 days before the survey.
- 2% (1%) of pupils responded that they have bought cigarettes with health warnings in a different language.
- □ 7% (10%) of pupils responded that they have 'never heard of' electronic cigarettes, while 70% (74%) said they have never used them.
- □ 5% (3%) of pupils responded that they use an electronic cigarette 'occasionally' or 'regularly'.
- □ 39% (31%) of pupils responded that their parents/carers smoke.
- □ 13% (9%) of pupils responded that someone smokes indoors at home in rooms that they use.
- 15% (13%) of pupils responded that someone smokes in a car when they are in it too.
- □ 50% (63%) of pupils responded that no-one ever smokes at home.
- □ 32% (24%) of pupils responded that smoking happens only outside.
- □ 5% (5%) of pupils responded that smoking happens on the doorstep only.
- 10% (6%) of pupils responded that smoking happens in certain rooms only.
- □ 3% (2%) of pupils responded that smokers can smoke anywhere in their home.

DRUGS

□ 41% (32%) of pupils responded that they are 'fairly sure' or 'certain' they know someone who takes drugs to get high.

- 23% (15%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis.
- 14% (10%) of pupils responded that they have been offered other illegal drugs or legal highs (not cannabis).
- □ 13% (6%) of pupils reported that they have taken drugs to get high (not medicines, tobacco or alcohol).
- □ 5% (3%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last month.
- □ 9% (4%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last year.

Emotional Health & Well-being

SATISFACTION

- 3% (4%) of pupils responded that they are 'not at all' happy with their life at the moment.
- □ 65% (65%) of pupils responded that they are at least 'quite' happy with their life at the moment.

SELF-ESTEEM

- □ 21% (23%) of pupils had a med-low self-esteem score (9 or less).
- □ 39% (42%) of pupils had a high self-esteem score (15 or more).
- □ 75% (77%) of pupils responded that they feel happy talking to other pupils at school.

WORRYING

- □ 72% (73%) of pupils responded that they worry about at least one of the issues listed 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- □ 43% (46%) of pupils responded that they worry about exams and tests 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- 75% (73%) of pupils responded that they know an adult they trust who they can talk to if they are worried about something, while 9% (8%) said they don't know anyone.

PROBLEM SOLVING

50% (53%) of pupils responded that they 'usually' or 'always' listen to music when they have a problem that worries them or they are feeling stressed, while 39% (46%) said they talk to someone about it.

RESILIENCE

- □ 37% (33%) of pupils had a low measure of resilience (0 19).
- □ 20% (20%) of pupils had a high measure of resilience (26+).
- □ 51% (53%) of pupils responded that when something goes wrong they 'usually' or 'always' learn from it for next time, while 24% (21%) said they get upset and feel bad for ages.
- 56% (55%) of pupils responded that if at first they don't succeed, they 'usually' or 'always' keep on trying until they do, while 41% (42%) ask for help and 10% (10%) give up.

Sexual Health

SEX & RELATIONSHIPS EDUCATION

- 77% (62%) of pupils responded that they have learned about contraception from school lessons, while 13% (26%) said they never learned about it anywhere.
- 81% (68%) of pupils responded that they have learned about sexually transmitted infections from school lessons, while 7% (15%) said they never learned about it anywhere.

CONTRACEPTION

□ 41% (31%) of pupils responded that they know where they can get condoms free of charge.

HEALTH & ADVICE SERVICES

- 83% (86%) of pupils responded that they have never heard of Catch 22, while 1% (1%) said that they know what it is, but not where or how to access it.
- 0% (0%) of pupils responded that they have used Catch 22.
- □ 86% (85%) of pupils responded that they have never heard of GUM clinics, while 2% (2%) said that they know what they are, but not where or how to access them.
- 0% (0%) of pupils responded that they have used GUM clinics.
- 71% (73%) of pupils responded that they have never heard of CASH clinics, while 6% (4%) said that they know what they are, but not where or how to access them.
- 1% (0%) of pupils responded that they have used CASH clinics.
- 48% (51%) of pupils responded that they have never heard of sexual health clinics just for young people, while 11% (10%) said that they know what they are, but not where or how to access them.
- 3% (1%) of pupils responded that they have used sexual health clinics just for young people.

YEAR 10+: SEXUAL RELATIONSHIPS

- □ 15% (11%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they think most young people start having sex aged 14 or younger.
- □ 39% (49%) of Year 10 + pupils responded that they think most young people start having sex aged 16 or 17.
- 2% (5%) of Year 10 + pupils responded that they think most young people start having sex aged 19 or older.
- □ 3% (3%) of Year 10 + pupils responded that they are currently in a relationship and thinking about having sex.
- □ 21% (11%) of Year 10 + pupils responded that they are either in a sexual relationship or have had one in the past.

Physical Activity ENJOY EXERCISE

- □ 3% (4%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy physical activities at all.
- □ 73% (74%) of pupils responded that they enjoy physical activities 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.

PE LESSONS

- 75% (74%) of pupils responded that they enjoy their PE lessons, while 15% (17%) are 'not sure' if they do.
- □ 69% (67%) of pupils responded that they feel they are getting better at PE, while 21% (21%) are 'not sure' if they are.

SCHOOL SPORTS

- □ 46% (47%) of pupils responded that their school has helped them to be more healthy, while 31% (33%) are 'not sure' if it has.
- 51% (43%) of pupils responded that they don't go to any sports clubs at lunch time or after school each week.
- 21% (28%) of pupils responded that they go to at least 3 sports clubs at lunch time or after school each week.
- □ 63% (65%) of pupils responded that they haven't played any sports games or matches at their school this year.
- 23% (20%) of pupils responded that they have played at least 4 matches at their school this year.
- □ 51% (48%) of pupils responded that they haven't played any games or matches against other schools this year.
- □ 32% (32%) of pupils responded that they have played at least 4 matches against other schools this year.
- 17% (18%) of pupils responded that they currently take part in sports volunteering or sports leadership.

EXERCISE

- □ 4% (7%) of boys and 13% (8%) of girls responded that they didn't do any physical activity in the week before the survey.
- □ 30% (34%) of boys and 14% (23%) of girls responded that they did physical activity on five days or more in the week before the survey.
- □ 31% (26%) of pupils responded that they didn't do any physical activity that caused them to get out of breath and/or sweaty in the week before the survey.
- 8% (12%) of pupils responded that they did physical activity that caused them to get out of breath and/or sweaty on at least 5 days in the week before the survey.
- 43% (39%) of pupils responded that they didn't do any physical activity that caused them to get out of breath and/or sweaty for an hour or more in the week before the survey.
- 5% (8%) of pupils responded that they did physical activity that caused them to get out of breath and/or

sweaty for an hour or more on at least 5 days in the week before the survey.

79% (80%) of pupils responded that their week's pattern of activity was usual, while 13% (11%) said it was more active than usual and 8% (10%) said it was less active than usual.

Health Services

DOCTOR

- □ 66% (71%) of pupils responded that they last visited the doctor in the last 6 months.
- □ 17% (13%) of pupils responded that they last visited the doctor more than a year ago.
- 21% (22%) of pupils responded that the reception and waiting room environment made them feel 'quite' or 'very' uneasy on their last visit to the doctor.
- 20% (20%) of pupils responded that the reception and waiting room environment made them feel 'at ease' on their last visit to the doctor.

AT SCHOOL

- 35% (31%) of pupils responded that there is a health clinic in their school, while 47% (55%) said they are 'not sure' if there is.
- 26% (47%) of pupils responded that they know who their School Nurse is, while 3% (2%) said they don't have one.
- □ 44% (56%) of pupils responded that they know how to get to see their School Nurse, while 28% (20%) said that they do not know.

DENTAL HEALTH

- 86% (84%) of pupils responded that they visited the dentist in the last 6 months.
- □ 4% (6%) of pupils responded that they last visited the dentist more than a year ago and 1% (1%) said they have never been.

Staying Safe

PEER PRESSURE

- 67% (64%) of pupils responded that they can 'usually or always' say no when a friend wants them to do something they don't want to do.
- 9% (9%) of pupils responded that they can 'rarely' or 'never' say no when a friend wants them to do something they don't want to do.

BULLYING

- 25% (25%) of pupils responded that they at least 'sometimes' feel afraid of going to school because of bullying.
- 6% (6%) of pupils responded that they 'often' or 'very often' feel afraid of going to school because of bullying.
- 20% (21%) of pupils responded that they have been bullied at or near school in the last 12 months, while 12% (13%) said they 'don't know' if they have been.

- 17% (13%) of pupils responded that they have deliberately upset or hurt someone else at school in the last 12 months, while 21% (20%) said they 'don't know' if they have.
- 21% (9%) of pupils responded that their school deals with bullying 'badly', while 2% (6%) said that bullying is not a problem in their school.
- □ 32% (46%) of pupils responded that their school deals with bullying 'quite' or 'very' well.
- □ 47% (66%) of pupils responded that they think their school takes bullying seriously, while 37% (24%) said they 'don't know' if it does.
- □ 15% (17%) of pupils responded that they were pushed/hit for no reason in the month before the survey and 10% (8%) said they have had belongings taken/broken.
- 19% (21%) of pupils responded that they experienced negative behaviour outside at school during breaktimes, while 20% (17%) said they experienced it in a classroom during breaktimes.
- 15% (15%) of pupils responded that they were bullied recently and told their Mum or Dad/carer, while 11% (10%) said they told a teacher or other staff at school.
- 11% (14%) of pupils responded that the bullying problem stopped after telling someone, while 11% (8%) said it didn't stop.
- 20% (19%) of boys and 30% (27%) of girls think they are being picked on or bullied because of their size or weight.
- 26% (21%) of boys and 49% (41%) of girls think they are being picked on or bullied because of the way they look.

LOCAL AREA

- □ 69% (77%) of pupils rated their safety at school as 'good' or 'very good'; 41% (51%) said the same of going out after dark.
- □ 14% (15%) of pupils rated their safety when going out after dark as 'poor' or 'very poor'; 5% (3%) said the same of being at school.

RELATIONSHIPS

27% (24%) of pupils responded that they have experienced at least one of the negative behaviours listed in a relationship with a past or current boyfriend/girlfriend.

E-SAFETY

- □ 81% (84%) of pupils responded that they have chatted on the internet.
- 36% (35%) of pupils responded that they chat to friends of friends on the internet, while 21% (21%) said they chat to other people who they don't know in real life.
- 18% (18%) of pupils responded that they have received a hurtful, nasty or scary message online, while 10% (8%) said someone has changed their password.

- 13% (10%) of pupils responded that they have given personal information to someone online who they didn't know in real life.
- 22% (20%) of pupils responded that someone online who they didn't know has asked to see pictures of them.
- 6% (5%) of pupils responded that someone (online or in person) has threatened or pressured them to send a picture or video of themselves or show themselves on webcam.
- □ 5% (2%) of pupils responded that they have sent sexual pictures of themselves to someone they <u>don't</u> <u>know</u>.
- 7% (6%) of pupils responded that they have sent sexual pictures of themselves to someone they <u>do</u> <u>know</u>.
- 20% (16%) of pupils responded that someone they don't know in person has asked to meet with them; 11% (6%) said this person was, as far as they know, quite a bit older than them and 5% (3%) said they did actually meet up with them.
- 91% (93%) of pupils responded that they have been told how to stay safe while online.
- 73% (73%) of pupils responded that they always follow the advice they have been given about how to stay safe online.
- □ 65% (63%) of pupils responded that they have blocked someone because of something upsetting that happened online and 2% (2%) said they have reported something to CEOP.

Enjoying & Achieving FUTURE PLANS

- □ 41% (47%) of boys and 47% (57%) of girls responded that they want to continue in full-time education at the end of Year 11.
- 37% (33%) of boys and 53% (39%) of girls responded that they want to find a job as soon as they can at the end of Year 11.
- □ 45% (47%) of boys and 41% (47%) of girls responded that they want to get training for a skilled job at the end of Year 11.
- □ 14% (11%) of boys and 13% (8%) of girls responded that they want to start a family at the end of Year 11.

SCHOOL LESSONS

- □ 46% (47%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'most' or 'all' of their lessons at school.
- 8% (9%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'hardly any' of their lessons at school.
- 17% (24%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about citizenship 'quite' or 'very' useful.
- 10% (15%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about citizenship 'not at all' useful.

ATTENDANCE

- □ 91% (89%) of pupils responded that they think it is important to go to school regularly, while 2% (3%) think it isn't important.
- □ 62% (68%) of pupils responded that they were away from school due to illness or injury in the 12 months before the survey, while 37% (41%) said they have been away due to doctor/dentist appointments.

EVERY CHILD MATTERS

27% (40%) of pupils responded that they think the school cares whether they are happy or not and 61% (68%) said their work is marked so they can see how to improve it.

Leisure

70% (74%) of pupils responded that they spent time watching TV after school on the day before the survey, while 56% (68%) did homework and 48% (47%) played video games.

□ 58% (61%) of pupils responded that they listened to music after school on the day before the survey, while 26% (28%) said they met with friends.

Making a Positive Contribution

- 54% (58%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about <u>what</u> they learn in school; 36% (40%) said their opinions make a difference and 46% (52%) would like to be consulted more often.
- 46% (52%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about <u>how</u> they learn in school;
 37% (44%) said their opinions make a difference and 45% (51%) would like to be consulted more often.
- 43% (49%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about the school environment;
 43% (47%) said their opinions make a difference and
 42% (47%) would like to be consulted more often.
- 29% (33%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about their community; 29% (32%) said their opinions make a difference and 37% (42%) would like to be consulted more often.

Significant Differences

Significant differences

Where differences can be seen between your school and the reference sample, you may find the enclosed table of some use in deciding if the differences seen are significant. The 'standard error' of a proportion is an assessment of how reliable our figures are, that is, the margin of error.

Two points in particular should be made:

- 1. when the sample size is small, it may be that just one individual voting a different way would make a large percentage difference to the results (so, one in twenty is 5%)
- 2. even if your sample is small, you may have a very high proportion of your available population if, say, you sample every single pupil of your Year 8 class. In this case, the notion of 'margin of error' doesn't really apply to the sampling, only to the process of collecting the responses.

So, if you have a sample of 50 students and 30% of them think that the school needs a new swimming pool, we can see from the table that standard error of the percentage is about $\pm 6.5\%$.

Pupil Comparisons

We have identified a few questions to consider in more detail to see how answers vary for different groups of students. We know that we get different answers depending on the age and experience of pupils and we also know that boys and girls often give different answers, for example to the physical activity questions, with boys in general being more active than the girls.

For each example, the question we are looking at is listed at the top of the table and beneath that, the question responses we are identifying are shown with the sample sizes involved.

The sample size for each table is shown in bold at the top of each column (overall Surrey Secondary data in brackets).

In the example above, 247 pupils in this school live with both parents together and 155 pupils don't.

When we look at the question which asks if they have free school meals, 9% of the whole school sample said they were compared with (10%) in the wider county sample. Breaking this down further by who they live with, 7% of pupils in this school who live with both parents had free school meals compared with 12% of pupils who don't live with both parents together.

Considerations

When interpreting the differences between the groups we have listed it is important to consider what else might have had an impact on the results. For example, girls generally record lower levels of high self-esteem so the observed differences may have more to do with gender differences than low/high self-esteem differences.








































































Q88. Percentage of pupils responding to questions about <u>what</u> they learn in school:


